Program: Nick England, K4NYW: "The 1950's Internet - The US Navy Radio Communications System"

Long before today's Internet existed, the US Navy created a worldwide radio communications system linking ships, shore stations, and aircraft. Text messages (and images) could be reliably routed anywhere in the world in seconds at any time 24/7. The engineering needed to make this all happen was truly mind-boggling - 2 MW transmitters, 30,000' tall (not a typo!) antennas, 70-tube frequency synthesizers, 3000 lb. receivers, and automated message routing centers, all long before integrated circuits, computers, and satellites made such capabilities commonplace. I'll try to provide a (hopefully) interesting and humorous look at the technology and people who made this vast system possible.

Nick England, K4NYW, has been a ham since the early 1960's. A 3D computer graphics and imaging hardware engineer, his hobby is collecting, restoring, and operating vintage radio gear. Nick's ham shack currently includes several tons of 1950's-60's Navy radio and teletype gear. His research into the subject has led him to create www.navy-radio.com with thousands of photos and documents on US Navy radio communications technology. He made a previous presentation to the DFMA on his collection of Heathkits.

APRS (continued)

A new APRS digipeater was installed on 10/24 at Red Mountain, just east of 15/501 near the Durham/Person County line. This will improve APRS tracker coverage for the Durham Habitat Halloween Bike Event on 10/29 and will probably be left in place for awhile.

Many thanks to Charlie, NC4CD, for making the tower and antenna available. The antenna is on the south leg of the tower 100' AGL or about 975' above sea level. (Picture courtesy of NC4CD.)

The digipeater belongs to OCRA and was previously located in Carboro, before being taken out of service.

Look for W4UNC-3 on aprs.fi. You will also see an object for the 443.275 Red Mountain NC4CD repeater, which is off the air for upgrading -- so ignore that for now. You may have to zoom in to separate the two objects on the map.



If you want to monitor the APRS activity for the Habitat bike ride, we will be using tactical ID's of HABSAG-n, where n = 1, 2 or 3 currently. There may be some additional ID's used. I did a short test drive on 10/24 using HABSAG-1.

I'll publish a link later that will allow you to see the course routes and APRS activity within Google Maps. Or you can just use aprs.fi (but you won't see the 31, 62 and 100-mile course routes).

If you are interested in getting an APRS tracker for use in public service events, I would be happy to assist.

President - Bob, W4RWC, called the meeting to order at 7:30pm.

REPORTS

ARES

There was no official representation, but Dee, who had attended two recent meetings dealing with the Habitat Bike Ride reported on his (and MK's) experience. A meeting of the organizers of the Ride convened at the Durham Bulls Athletic Park (DBAP) on 10/11. Randy, K4XRM, MK, and Dee represented ARES/DFMA. Much of the meeting dealt with the actual ride logistics.

Randy offered APRS trackers in addition to communications support at rest stops and other key locations, especially Start/Finish at the DBAP. The group expressed appreciation for our participation.

At a subsequent ARES meeting on 10/13 at the Durham Red Cross, plans were made on how to get trackers and other equipment together and how to recruit more participants, specifically at the upcoming OCRA meeting which has many DFMA members attending as well as some potential OCRA-only folks. This was attended by K4XRM, W3QAHL, KK4PH, W4MKR, and KU4GC. It was agreed to have a final meeting before the event on Monday, 10/24. Steve also offered to post routing and other information on the Durham ARES Yahoo Group: DNC-ARES:

OLD BUSINESS

Ken, KI4QXY, reported that **WinMor** is now working and is ready to install in the MCU. He is planning to work on documentation.

Rhett, KE4HIH, reported the the **2011 Hamnic** had been a great success with 25 attendees.

There is a **vacant board position**. Nominations are being sought. Several names were discussed.

NEW BUSINESS

+ In response to email sent to the DFMA via its web site by a Jim Price, Wilson, tried to find out more about an unused **tower on Jordan Lake**. Some preliminary email has produced little information. Wilson will follow up and Vic, K0OUX, planned to take a "field trip" to get a look at the tower and get its exact location, and possibly determine what, if any, antennas are mounted on the tower.

+ The Board unanimously approved that, as in the past few years, the Club will pay for the meals at the **December Holiday Dinner Meeting** (on 12/6).

+ Via email, Wayne, KJ4GDW, alerted the club to a very good deal on a **Optoma PRO250X projector** going for under \$300 (with a typical on-line price of \$450-550). Using Email between Board members, there was much positive discussion. Wilson who had informally advocated that the Club purchase a projector felt we should find a projector with a longer lens so that the projector can be on a tripod and shoot over the tables. He subsequently found that those tended to cost thousands of dollars. He hopes to find something with a long enough lens that will allow setting up with a small tripod on the tables, further from the screen than the one we've been using, for under \$500. If he finds a specific one that is attractive he will bring it up at a future

meeting. [As of this writing, the special deal found by Wayne is no longer available.] (Dee has been borrowing a projector from Duke Computer Science and hopes to continue to do so as long as it is needed.)

+ Dee and MK raised the question whether **auto-patch** on the DFMA repeaters still made sense. It is very seldom used and costs over \$800 a year for the two phone lines, one in Durham and one in Hillsborough. Charlie noted that the alarm systems for the cabinet at the VA and the shed in Hillsborough use those phone lines to alert him to any intrusions. Dee felt no action was necessary at this time but it is something to think about.
